### August 4 – Lancaster, PA

We visited and ministered at ACTS Covenant Fellowship in Lancaster. The congregation recently commissioned 75 members (including children) of their church family to plant a new church in Strasburg, PA. The congregation also renovated a home in Leola, PA, to serve as a discipleship home for men who have been discharged from incarceration. ### August 7-9 – Elizabethtown, PA

Approximately 120 people from various networks within Kingdom Life Network (KLN) were inspired by the teaching and fellowship at KLN IMPACT 2019. We

were enriched, encouraged, challenged and equipped by the teaching of Evangelist Jonathan Conrathe from England. Jonathan has been involved in full-time



evangelistic ministry for 30 years. His teachings were very Christ-centered and based on God's Word. His stories of lives that were radically changed by an encounter with the Lord were very interesting. We visited and ministered at Disciples International Christian Church (DICC). This summer, the city of Portland was the recipient of 300 new refugee families, (over 1000 people) primarily from the Congo but also other African countries. The congregation, with some generous financial assistance from other HFC congregations, has been reaching out to assist these families with food and other necessities. Recently, Mennonite Central Committee made a generous donation of comforters and other supplies in order to help the congregation in their outreach.



The congregation is growing under the leadership of Pastor Lawum Kayamba, his wife Suzanne, (left) and other leaders. Relationships have

been established with many of the refugee families. Now, out of necessity, some families are moving to other parts of Maine. Pastor Kayamba would like to start house churches in other towns and cities where these people have moved. Please pray with us that God will provide the resources necessary to allow this to happen.

**August 25 – 31, Pemaquid, ME**

We were refreshed with a restful week at Pemaquid Point, ME. A lot of reading, walking, reflecting and



sightseeing occupied the week. We enjoyed several sunrises over the ocean. Because Pemaquid Point,
